## Soapstone carvings at Wilder Museum

Gravel, limestone, sandstone, granite, quartz, marble and soapstone. Have you heard of soap stone? You don't wash with it. It's a soft type of stone with talc in it and has unique properties that allow it to be carved with simple tools. Carved soapstone has been around for 3,000 years and soapstone carvings have been found in cultures all over the world from India to Scandinavia to the Americas. They often hold deep symbolic meanings related to mythology, religion, and other important cultural traditions.

The museum has soap stone carvings collected by Blanche Baldridge and her sister, Gladys Kenneally. The carvings are very
