

Collins concerned with Muscatine-China student trip

He called on MCHS to cancel student exchange

Another Iowa representative has expressed concerns over the Muscatine Community School District's (MCSD) newfound connections with China.

A day after Iowa Congresswoman Mariannette Miller-Meeks released a statement

speaking about MCSD's student trips to China, which first occurred in January 2024, State Rep. Taylor Collins gave his own statement.

After reading the Daily Mail UK article that was originally cited by Miller-Meeks, Collins stated that "The Chinese Communist Party is not our friend, and they should not be treated with kid gloves. As a Representative for Muscatine County, I am appalled to see students and staff from Muscatine High School being used as political propaganda for the CCP (Chinese Communist Party)".

Collins continued, saying that he was calling on the MCSD to "publicly cancel the upcoming student exchange for this October, and any future trips to China paid for by the Chinese Communist Party."

He concluded his statement by sharing his plans to introduce
