

Elma man receives up to 10 year sentence on sex abuse guilty plea

An Elma man who was charged with sexual abuse of a young girl while he was living in Charles City has been sentenced to up to 10 years in prison after pleading guilty to a reduced charge.

Randy Lee Nibaur, age 62, was arrested and charged in January 2023 with sexual abuse in the second degree, a Class B Felony, for allegedly having sexual contact several times with a girl that he was babysitting from November 2018 to August 2021 while the girl was age 2 to 4.

According to a complaint filed in Floyd County District Court, the girl described the incidents to a Minnesota.

Trial had been scheduled to begin last October, but the day before trial was set to begin in Floyd County District Court, the

An Alford plea means the defendant agrees that the prosecution has enough evidence to likely convince a jury of his guilt beyond a reasonable doubt and he will accept sentencing, but he does not admit guilt. The criminal record impact is the same as pleading guilty, and can result in the same sentences.

On Monday this week, Judge DeDra Schroeder sentenced Nibaur to an indeterminate prison term not to exceed 10 years, and ordered him to pay a \$1,370 fine plus 15% crime services surcharge and other fees and penalties.

judge accepted Nibaur's Alford plea of guilty to a charge of sexual abuse in the third degree, a Class C felony.

Schroeder also ordered that Nibaur serve Iowa's Special Sentence for sexual crimes, meaning Nibaur will be under the supervision of the Iowa Department of Correctional Services for the rest of his life after he is released from prison. He must also register on the Iowa Sexual Offender Registry.

On Tuesday a court document was filed stating that Nibaur had posted a \$10,000 appeal bond and another document states that he has filed an official notice that he is appealing the final judgment and the sentencing, "and all adverse rulings therein."

A defendant who pleads guilty is typically not able to appeal the verdict without a showing of good cause.

Alabama woman gets probation, fine for participating in Charles City fight

An Alabama woman who pleaded guilty to a reduced charge for her involvement in a fight at a Charles City hotel last May has been sentenced to a suspended prison sentence, a fine and to three years of probation.

Sametra Lequan Perkins, age 40, was arrested in Greensboro, Alabama, in November 2023 and transported to the Floyd County Jail. She was charged with willful injury resulting in serious injury, a Class C felony, for allegedly stomping the head of a "clearly unconscious" man while her boyfriend, "Laron Robert Martin," punched him.

Later last November Perkins entered a written plea of guilty to the reduced charge of assault causing serious injury, a Class D felony.

On Monday in Floyd County District Court, Judge DeDra Schroeder sentenced Perkins to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in prison, suspended, ordered her to pay a \$1,025 fine and 15% crime services surcharge and other fees and damages, and placed her on three years

probation with the Iowa Department of Correctional Services.

Her boyfriend, Martin, age 34, of Selma, Alabama, had been arrested a few days after the incident and also charged with willful injury resulting in serious injury. He pleaded guilty in September to a reduced charge of assault causing serious injury, a Class D felony.

Martin was sentenced in October to three years probation and ordered to pay victim restitution, but was given a deferred judgment.

Perkins' plea agreement recommended the same sentence Martin received and indicated that Perkins would also seek a deferred judgment, however Judge Schroeder did not order that the judgment be deferred.

A deferred judgment means if the defendant meets all the terms of the probation and financial obligations, the judge will dismiss the case and expunge the records.

The judge retains the power to enter a judgment of guilty and impose a sentence if the defendant conditions are not met.

Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Supv Jorgensen attended Ambulance Commission and Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council meetings. Supv Keifer attended Communications. Supv Keifer, FCC Landfill, Board of Health, Main St Charles City, Joint Entity, and NIACOG Emergency Response and Planning meetings. Supv Kuhn attended NIACOG and County Social Services meetings and spoke at the Board of Health meeting.

Updates on Law Enforcement Center/Courthouse Project: Supv Keifer informed the Board of receiving two estimates on the water softener project; one additional estimate is expected to come in. Jason McLendon, Samuels Group Project Manager, is onsite to review a list of unfinished work and will make sure credits for cost of alternate heat last year and rocks in pipes this summer are given. Youngs Plumbing is onsite wrapping up unfinished work. Samuels Group superintendent will be working on some ceilings. McLendon would like the board to consider an arrangement for the most recent pay. Auditor Carr informed the board of a leak in the atrium and concerns of snow buildup at the south employee entrances.

Andrea Eversizer, Healthy Harvest Executive Director, provided an overview of the program and local highlights of 2023 activities. Federal funding may not be extended in 2024 which could add to food insecurities in Iowa. The agency is seeking a local board member, would like to expand local outreach, and has been asked to provide technical assistance in the local farmers market initiatives. The FY23 budget funding request of \$1,500. Supv Kuhn will contact the Mennonite community to see if they are aware of this program and its initiatives.

Kelsey Uetz, Floyd County Fair Board president, presented the agency treasurer's report, improvements over the last two years and their "To Do" list. The agency is requesting the county maintain the \$10,000 contribution to the fair and the \$12,000 for the collection

site in FY25.

McKenna Lloyd, Floyd County Historical Society and Museum Director, provided an overview of the museum's projects and a FY25 funding request of \$2,000 to jumpstart Phase Two of their Film Digitizing project.

The Board noted fees collected by the Sheriff, Recorder and Auditor for the quarter ending December 31.

The Board noted the resignation of Stacie Mulling, Jailer, effective January 17.

The Board noted receipt of the Compensation Board's minutes reflecting the following recommended salaries: Auditor-6.85% increase to \$86,940, Recorder-5.07% increase to \$78,437.91, Treasurer-5.9% to \$79,057.53, Sheriff-10.06% increase to \$115,467.25, and Supervisors-3.5% to \$41,501.43. The Board will act on setting increases in the future following the budget review process.

The Board noted the resignation of Jeff Sherman in his duties as Zoning Administrator and 911 signs, effective March 29.

At the request of Tyler Sullivan and Brandon Houdek, Kuhn provided photos of where flags were placed by Jeff Sherman, Zoning Administrator, Sullivan, and HRS Surveying staff. Keifer/Kuhn moved to approve a settlement agreement between Tyler Sullivan, Brandon Houdek, and Floyd County. Motion carried 2-1 with Supv Jorgensen opposing.

The Board recessed at 10:40 a.m. and reconvened at 10:45 a.m.

The Board conducted FY25 budget reviews for the following departments: Engineer, Information Technology, Zoning, 911, Emergency Communications System (Fund 34000), Library, Clerk of Court, Auditor, Courthouse, General Services. The Debt service budget will be presented at the next board meeting.
