Elma man receives up to 10 year sentence on sex abuse guilty plea

An Elma man who was charged with sexual abuse of a young girl while he was living in Charles City has been sentenced to up to 10 years in prison after pleading guilty to a reduced charge.

Randy Lee Nibaur, age 62, was arrested and charged in January 2023 with sexual abuse in the second degree, a Class B Felony, for allegedly having sexual contact several times with a girl that he was babysitting from November 2018 to August 2021 while the girl was age 2 to 4.

According to a complaint filed in Floyd County District Court, the girl described the incidents to a forensic interviewer in Minnesota.

Trial had been scheduled to begin last October, but the day before trial was set to begin in Floyd County District Court, the

An Alford plea means the defendant agrees that the prosecution has enough evidence to likely convince a jury of his guilt beyond a reasonable doubt and he will accept sentencing, but he does not admit guilt. The criminal record impact is the same as pleading guilty, and can result in the same sentences.

On Monday this week, Judge DeDra Schroeder sentenced Nibaur to an indeterminate prison term not to exceed 10 years, and ordered him to pay a \$1,370 fine plus 15% crime services surcharge and other fees and penalties.

Schroeder also ordered that Nibaur serve Iowa's Special Sentence for sexual crimes, meaning Nibaur will be under the supervision of the Iowa Department of Correctional Services for the rest of his life after he is released from prison. He must also register on the Iowa Sexual Offender Registry.

Alabama woman gets probation, fine for participating in Charles City fight

An Alabama woman who pleaded guilty to a reduced charge for her involvement in a fight at a Charles City hotel last May has been sentenced to a suspended prison sentence, a fine and to three years of probation. Sametra Lequan Perkins, age 40, was arrest-

ed in Greensboro, Alabama, in November 2023 and transported to the Floyd County Jail. She was charged with willful injury resulting in serious injury, a Class C felony, for allegedly stomping the head of a "clearly unconscious" man while her boyfriend, Laron Robert Martin, punched him. Later last November Perkins entered a written

plea of guilty to the reduced charge of assault causing serious injury, a Class D felony.

On Monday in Floyd County District Court, Judge DeDra Schroeder sentenced Perkins to an indeterminate term not to exceed five years in prison, suspended, ordered her to pay a \$1,025 fine and 15% crime services surcharge and other fees and damages, and placed her on three years

probation with the Iowa Department of Correctional Services.

Her boyfriend, Martin, age 34, of Selma, Alabama, had been arrested a few days after the incident and also charged with willful injury resulting in serious injury. He pleaded guilty in September to a reduced charge of assault caus-

ing serious injury, a Class D felony. Martin was sentenced in October to three years probation and ordered to pay victim restitution, but was given a deferred judgment.
