Gustafson Lake stocked with trout

The Buena Vista County Conservation Board has stocked Gabrielson Park-Gustafson Lake by Sioux Rapids with trout. The trout were placed right before Christmas but with poor ice conditions the announcement wasn't made at that time. Most of the fish stocked at Gabrielson Park range from three-fourths of a pound to 1 pound and there were quite a few that were over 2 pounds.

All Iowa Department of Natural Resources fishing regulations must be followed. Anglers will need a valid 2024 fishing license and the trout fee to fish for or possess trout. Fishing license and trout fee can be purchased at any fishing license retailer or online at the Iowa DNR's website.

Children under 16 can fish for trout with a properly licensed adult, but they must limit their catch to one combined daily limit. The child can purchase a trout fee which will allow them to catch their own limit. The daily limit is five trout per licensed angler with a possession limit of 10.

REBELS DEFEATED

The Sioux Central boys basketball team played Emmetsburg losing 73-43.

"I really liked the aggressiveness we came out with, we were able to get to the free-throw line and put them in some early foul trouble and got them out of the usual subbing patterns," coach Stephen Tjaden said.

Owen Mills had nine points and 10 rebounds on the night. The team made 14 of 42 field goals; 3 of 20 3-point shots and 12 of 13 free throws.

"We had some opportunities in the second half to get their lead to single digits but were unable to convert and they took advantage and were able to stretch the lead in the third quarter," Tjaden said. "Our consistency needs to continue to improve if we want to compete with the best teams on our league the rest of the season."

Overall, the team had 21 rebounds, one steal, five assists and 17 turnovers.

The boys played South Central Calhoun on the road being defeated 50-25.

"I was very pleased with our defensive effort tonight, we threw a wrinkle at the guys right before the game and they executed it extremely well," Tjaden said. "We communicated, rotated, and really played with a great amount of effort all night to limit them as best we could."

Jaylen Champ put in 10 points for the team. Sioux Central made 11 of 48 attempted field goals, 2 of 23 3-point shots, and 1 of 2 free throws.

"Unfortunately on the offensive end we were unable to connect on enough," Tjaden said. "Later in the game we did a better job of attacking gaps and being aggressive but were just unable to finish. We need to continue to improve on both ends."

REBEL GIRLS WIN OVER SCC

The Sioux Central Rebels girls basketball team played South Central Calhoun Friday, winning

decisively 68-21.

"We got off to a really hot start by scoring 31 in the first quarter and 20 in the second," coach Kasey Krager said. "Our intensity, rebounding and ball movement was awesome in the first half and the shots were falling. It was a nice team effort."

Bradi Krager put in 21 points; and Morgan Christian scored 20, giving her 1,000 points.

"Congratulations to Morgan Christian on scoring 1,000 points in her career," Kasey Krager said. "She has worked hard for this and done a lot for the program. It's also a big accomplishment for the whole team as they are part of it."

The girls record stands at 12-1, 5-1.

WRESTLERS COMPETE AT SAC CITY

The Sioux Central girls wrestling team competed Monday night at the East Sac Girls Tournament held in Sac City.

The team finished fourth out of 11 with only seven girls. Makala Zeka and Odola Cham did not wrestle and they are two of the team's top competitors.

Individual results were Nichole Hart, 115 pounds, earned fifth place, 2-1; April Banda, at 120, was runner up with 1-1; Stevy Griffin, at 130, was runner up with 2-1; Vivi Orenday, at 135, came in fourth, going 0-2; Kiely Morrow earned fifth place going 2-1; Sigrid Adams earned runner up place, 2-1; and Cadence Hartley, at 155, was 0-2 and finished seventh place.

"I am happy with how we fought tonight," coach Joel McCoy said. "Nichole and April got back on track a little bit after a tough first week of the year. Our three finalists fought hard to earn silver on the night. I was also very happy with Kiely Morrow stepping in at 140 and she continues to improve every day. The next three days we hope to make some adjustments heading into our tough region."

The girls will compete in a regional tournament at Sioux City on Friday at Tyson Event Center.

KITCHEN FAVORITES

CHERRY OATMEAL PIE

- 2 cups oatmeal
- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup oleo, melted
- 1 teaspoon baking soda, dissolved in small amount of water

Combine oleo, brown sugar and baking soda. Add flour and oatmeal. Put 3/4 of mixture into a 9-by-13-inch pan. Bake 10 minutes at 350. Put 2 cans of thickened cherries on top of first mixture. Spread remaining mixture on top. Bake until medium brown at 350.
