President Stearns called the regular meeting to order at 6:00 PM. Roll Call was taken. Urban, Carter, Obermiller, Jones, and Stearns were present. Also present were Superintendent Hood, Elementary Principal Nielsen, Jr/Sr High School Principal Scott, and Secretary Kirkpatrick. Seven visitors were in attendance. Board President Stearns led the pledge of allegiance.

President Stearns asked if any of the guests wished to speak in open forum. No one did.

Public Presenters
Kattie Lewis reported for SWITCH. Her report is online.

Mark Pfister from Boyd Jones reported that two staff groups toured the building project site. The new building has a roof, and the window frames are in. The brick is going on the outside of the building now. Drywall will start going up in the new classrooms next week following the electrical inspection. Work on the stage and gym was done over the break. The office areas are entering the final stages. Things are moving along well. Next Tuesday there will be meetings in both buildings to look at furniture. The playground vendor was selected last week. The snow isn't hampering the schedule at this time.

Board/Student Learning
Heather Weiss from Avenue Scholars gave a presentation of the program they offer to high school students through the Charles Lakin Foundation. Avenue Scholars, the leader in bridging the gap between education and business, guarantees careers for our youth of hope and need through supportive relationships, individualized coaching, education, and training.

Approval of Agenda

Jones made a motion to accept the FY23 audit, seconded by Obermiller. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Urban made a motion to approve a resolution allowing the General Fund to make a loan to the Capital Projects fund. Obermiller seconded the motion. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Obermiller made a motion to approve Board Policy 800.1, seconded by Jones. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Jones made a motion to approve the advertising agreement from Malvern Bank. Carter seconded the motion. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Obermiller made a motion to postpone the approval of a furniture vendor. Urban seconded the motion. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Obermiller made a motion to approve the SWITCH lease agreement with edits discussed. Urban seconded the motion. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Obermiller made a motion to approve Board Policies 502.07, 605.6, 605.6R1, 605.8, 605.8R1 with the following changes: Add vaping after tobacco everywhere the word tobacco is in 502.07. Policy 605.6R1 complete Section V with 1. "Up to 3 weeks", 2. "Up to 18 weeks", 3. "12 months", fix spelling of procedure and clean up format. In Policy 605.08 correct the spelling in the title, and take the note out. Carter seconded the motion. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried. Transportation Director, Curtis Riley, presented bus leasing and buying options to the Board. Obermiller made a motion to purchase three, and lease four buses for the best price from Hoglund Bus Company. Carter seconded the motion. Ayes-5 Nays-0. Motion carried.

Administrative Reports
The administrative reports are all online. Elementary Principal Nielsen

reported on upcoming events, instruction, and data - Winter testing taking place this month - MAP, FAST, Spelling Inventory, PAST - Once testing is done, we will dig into the data with teachers and rearrange WIN groups ISASP preparation is starting. We are testing at the beginning of April. In other news, two paras are currently working on their para certification and taking classes. Movie day before break was a success, the Grinch, Santa, and Ms. Claus stopped by for a visit. PTO provided hot cocoa and cookies.

Jr/Sr High School Principal Scott reported that he and the Guidance department are working to create the 2024-25 schedule. This new schedule will incorporate 6th graders into the secondary schedules with core classes in Math, English, Science, and Social Studies. East Mills currently is looking to add a teaching position or two to accommodate these scheduling changes.

Communication/Information
The Board discussed increasing the dollar amount for meals for students when they attend activities. This will be an agenda item in February. President Stearns gave an update on the East Mills Foundation. A grant application for playground equipment is ready to be submitted.
